#### Objective

To help students practice recalling key details from a text about states.

#### Supplies

- My State book
- My State True or False worksheet (attached)
- Pencils

#### **Before the Activity**

Read *My State* out loud to students. Print a copy of the My State True or False worksheet for each student. Hand out worksheets and pencils to students.

#### Activity

*My State* includes several details about the different parts of a state. The worksheet has several sentences about these details. But some of the sentences are false. Students should read each sentence carefully and decide whether it is true or false. They should write a T or an F in the blank by each sentence to give their answer.

#### **Evaluation**

Use the attached answer key to give students 1 point for each correct answer, for up to 6 points.
